## **COURSE DETAILS**

## **CHC51015 Diploma of Counselling**

(This course is a nationally recognised course)

**Course Structure**: Structured in 8 Clusters delivered over 24 months; 17 units of study (13 core units and 1 mandatory elective unit and 3 elective units)

**Course delivery**: Blended mode of self-paced learning and practical training.

**Course requirements**: To qualify for the Diploma of Counselling, students must successfully complete the 17 units of study.

It is required that students attend at least 100 hours of practical training in preparation for the role of a counsellor.

**Practical training**: Practical training sessions are delivered once a month during school terms (usually Saturdays) in Tamworth.

Training includes a range of counselling and psychotherapy models. This course provides a unique training opportunity which is otherwise not available to students outside metropolitan areas.

**Course fees**: Tuition & admin fees apply. Payment is requested at the commencement of each Cluster of units offered. Payment plans are available.
